### Georgia Division Sends Archives to Hargrett Rare Book and Manuscript Library

The thirty boxes of the archives of the Georgia Division and the Georgia Foresters Hall of Fame records were delivered to the Hargrett Rare Book and Manuscripts Library at UGA on November 6. The archives were contained in twenty-four boxes while the Hall of Fame records totalled six boxes.

I will soon send the index of the contents of the division archives to Leslie Batten who will add it to the Georgia Division website, [www.gadiv.net](http://www.gadiv.net). I will also send it to the Forest History Society. The Hargrett library will assign two numbers to the collection, one for the Division Archives and one for the Hall of Fame records. This will make it easier for people who want to look at just the Hall of Fame records to get at them more easily.

Chuck Barber, the Manuscripts Librarian advised that he will place all the records in acid-free manilla folders to protect them. Any forester or member of the public can go the Hargrett library and view the material there. Nothing can be removed but copies can be

made. Anyone can go to a university system college in Georgia and through Galileo, the online UGA search tool, get into GIL, the library's search tool to look up the number and contents of the archives. This won't be available for a month. Check the website for news on this. If you are at the university and wish to look at the archives, you can look up the number at the library, then go the third floor of the library, take a left to visit the Hargrett Library and the archives.

I sent a note to Harry Vanderveer, our 1999 Chairman, telling him I had done this. He was the one who brought me the division archives up to 1999. Klaus Steinbeck brought me the Hall of Fame records. Thanks to these gentleman and to all the chairs, and secretary/treasurers from 1999 to the present who have sent me their records, we have our archives at UGA where they will be safe, stable and available to foresters, scholars and the public.
